



## Seminar – Round Table Discussion “Barriers and Stimuli in Land Management”

### CALL for Papers

The Seminar and Round Table Discussion “Barriers and Stimuli in Land Management” is organised by the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences (BOKU) and supported by the Jean Monnet Networks project no. 564651-EPP-1-2015-1-SK- EPPJMO-NETWORK “Sustainable Land Management Network”.

The objective of the Seminar and the Round-Table Discussion is to outline international land management practices and to highlight barriers and stimuli faced by current land management.

The target group for the Seminar/Round Table Discussion are researchers, teachers and students.

The workshop will be organized in three stages:

- 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> November 2017: Keynotes on the topic “Land Management in an international context” given by invited speakers.
- 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018: Impulse presentations about concepts of “Land Administration” and “Land Use Planning” on the example of selected countries.
- 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018: Round Table Discussion based on the impulse presentations with the focus on “Barriers and Stimuli in Land Management” and short presentation of results in the plenary.

English is the official language of the Seminar and Round Table Discussion. We welcome submissions from teams (two persons) for impulse presentations (15 minutes). Extended abstracts with a minimum of 1500 characters have to be submitted until 18<sup>th</sup> December 2017 in digital format to the BOKUlearn platform (<https://learn.boku.ac.at/course/view.php?id=14857>).

Topics to be focused on trade-offs include the following:

- Land Administration: Cadastre, Land registration and Land Valuation
- Land Use Planning: Contents, Stakeholders and Decision Making Processes
